

QP23 Comparative Literature and Film Studies

Programme structure(s) and requirements, levels and modules

Overall requirements for students entering in Year 1 of this programme in or after September 2015

You must take 120 credits in each year of study, meeting all programme and pathway requirements, and will only be able to progress to the next developmental year if you have met the progression requirements. To be eligible for the award of your degree you must have passed a minimum of 315 credits, including 90 credits at level 6.

You must take a minimum of 135 credits in Comparative Literature modules and a minimum of 135 credits in Film Studies modules over the period of your studies. Some of these credits will be from compulsory modules, and some will be from optional modules within your subject areas which you can choose each year. You may also take up to 90 credits outside your subject areas in the course of your degree.

Students entering Year 1 in 2017-18 will be required to study at least one QMUL Model module in each year of study. In Year 1, the QMUL Model module(s) will be one or more of the core or compulsory modules associated with your degree. In subsequent years, you will be able to choose from a range of options.

The regulations below outline the requirements for which modules you have to take in each year of study, and what you have to achieve to progress to the next year.

Year 1 – Level 4

You will take the following **120 credits**:

- 15 credits Introduction to Literature (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Introduction to Comparison (compulsory module and QMUL Model module)
- 15 credits The Scene of Learning (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Understanding Culture: An Introduction to Cultural Theory (compulsory module)
- 0 credits Critical Thinking and Writing for Comparative Literature
- 30 credits Concepts and History (compulsory module and QMUL Model module)
- 30 credits Approaches and Analysis (compulsory module)

Requirements for progression to Year 2

To successfully progress from Year 1 to Year 2 you must pass a minimum of 90 credits, and achieve an average mark of 40.0 or higher across all the credits you have taken.

Year 2 – Level 5

You will take the following **60 credits**:

- 15 credits The Scene of Reading (compulsory module)
- 15 credits optional modules to be chosen from COM-/SML- coded modules at level 5
- 30 credits What is Cinema? (compulsory module)

You will choose the remaining **60 credits** from:

- optional modules offered in Comparative Literature
- optional modules offered in Film Studies
- all modules offered in the School of Languages, Linguistics and Film
- all modules offered in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

Registration is subject to space available on modules, and with the guidance of your adviser. At least 30 credits of these modules must be at level 5. You may choose up to 30 credits at level 4 or level 6 with the agreement of your adviser.

Progression Requirements to Final Year

To successfully progress from Year 2 to the Final Year, you must pass a minimum of 90 credits in Year 2, and have passed a minimum of 195 credits in total from Year 1 and Year 2, and achieve an average mark of 40.0 or higher across all the credits you have taken.

Year 3 – Level 6

You will take the following **90 credits**:

- 15 credits The Scene of Writing (compulsory module)
- 30 credits optional modules to be chosen from COM-/SML- coded modules at level 6
- 45 credits optional modules to be chosen from FLM-coded modules at level 6

You will choose the remaining **30 credits** from:

- optional modules offered in Comparative Literature
- optional modules offered in Film Studies
- all modules offered in the School of Languages, Linguistics and Film
- all modules offered in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

Registration is subject to space available on modules, and with the guidance of your adviser. You may choose these credits at level 5 or level 6. You are not allowed to take level 4 modules in your final year. Note that the programme structure only requires you to take a minimum of 90 credits at level 6; you must also pass a minimum of 90 credits at level 6 to be eligible for your degree and may wish to bear this in mind when making module choices.

Requirements for Award

To be eligible for your degree, you must pass a minimum of 315 credits in total, including a minimum of 90 credits at level 6.
