• <u>Bilingual dictionaries</u>: we recommend *The Oxford Spanish Dictionary* or the *Collins Spanish Dictionary*. Buy the latest edition possible; however, earlier editions are also useful.

- Good monolingual dictionaries are Clave: Diccionario de uso del espanol actual (Madrid: Ediciones SM, 2006) and Diccionario abreviado del español actual (Madrid: Aguilar, 2000).
- Grammars: at first-year stage we recommend Pilar Muñoz & Mike Thacker, A Spanish Learning Grammar (London: Arnold, 2001).
