

## QQH1 English Language and Linguistics

### Programme structure(s) and requirements, levels and modules

#### Overall requirements for students entering in Year 1 of this programme from 2015

You must take 120 credits in each year of study, meeting all programme and pathway requirements, and will only be able to progress to the next developmental year if you have met the progression requirements. To be eligible for the award of your degree you must have passed a minimum of 315 credits, including 90 credits at level 6.

You must take a minimum of 240 credits in Linguistics modules over the period of your studies. Some of these credits will be from compulsory modules, and some will be from optional modules within your subject area which you can choose each year. You may also take up to 120 credits outside your subject area in the course of your degree.

The regulations below outline the requirements for which modules you have to take in each year of study, and what you have to achieve to progress to the next year.

#### Year 1 – Level 4

You must take the following **120 credits**:

- 30 credits Foundations of Linguistics (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Language in the UK (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Sounds of English (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Introduction to Phonology (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Introduction to English Syntax (compulsory module)
- 15 credits Languages of the World (compulsory module)
- 15 credits English in Use (compulsory module)
- 0 credits Critical Thinking and Writing for Linguistics

#### Progression Requirements to Year 2

To successfully progress from Year 1 to Year 2 you must pass a minimum of 90 credits, and achieve an average mark of 40.0 or higher across all the credits you have taken.

#### Year 2 – Level 5 (2016-17 onwards)

You must take the following **60 credits**:

- 15 credits Research Methods in Linguistics (compulsory level 5 module)
- 45 credits chosen from the following:
  - 15 credits Aspects of Meaning
  - 15 credits Explaining Grammatical Structure
  - 15 credits Sociolinguistic Variation and Change
  - 15 credits History of English

You will choose the remaining **60 credits** from:

- optional modules offered in Linguistics
- all modules offered in the School of Languages, Linguistics and Film
- all modules offered in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

Registration is subject to space available on modules, and with the guidance of your adviser. At least 30 credits of these modules must be at level 5. You may choose up to 30 credits at level 4 or level 6 with the agreement of your adviser.

### **Progression Requirements to Final Year**

To successfully progress from Year 2 to the Final Year, you must pass a minimum of 90 credits in Year 2, and have passed a minimum of 195 credits in total from Year 1 and Year 2, and achieve an average mark of 40.0 or higher across all the credits you have taken.

### **Final Year – Level 6 (2017-18 onwards)**

You must take the following **60 credits**:

- 30 credits Linguistics Research Project (compulsory module)
- 30 credits optional modules to be chosen from LIN-coded modules at Level 6.

You will choose the remaining **60 credits** from:

- optional modules offered in Linguistics
- all modules offered in the School of Languages, Linguistics and Film
- all modules offered in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

Registration is subject to space available on modules, and with the guidance of your adviser. At least 30 credits of these modules must be at level 6. You may choose up to 30 credits at level 5. You are not allowed to take level 4 modules in your final year. Note that the programme structure only requires you to take a minimum of 90 credits at level 6; you must also pass a minimum of 90 credits at level 6 to be eligible for your degree and may wish to bear this in mind when making module choices.

### **Requirements for Award**

To be eligible for your degree, you must pass a minimum of 315 credits in total, including a minimum of 90 credits at level 6.
